Five-Transition Adventure Planner

Instructions: This planning sheet will help you create a short adventure story based on five transition words. In your story, your adventurer will need to escape a foe or enemy or obstacle; in escaping, your adventurer will save a valuable treasure item. Other than these requirements, your story is to be completely original and full of interesting details. Your story can begin in the middle of some exciting action. <p>Draft your adventure's second attempt to get the treasure item. <p>Draft the moment from your adventure scene where your main character gets the treasure. In the first sentence or two, you need to use the transition word you have circled at right:</p>	<p>Circle a transition word:</p> <hr/> <p>however... nevertheless... furthermore... nonetheless... instead... besides... undoubtedly... therefore...</p> <hr/> <p>(your own word— check with teacher)</p>
<p>Draft a conclusion to your adventure scene here. In the first sentence or two, you need to use the transition word you have circled at right:</p>	<p>Circle a transition word:</p> <hr/> <p>finally... as a result... soon after... in short... due to... indeed... most importantly... at long last...</p> <hr/> <p>(your own word— check with teacher)</p>
